Pvt. Richard E. "Dick" McAnany Age 22

Born 1920. Died April 30, 1942. Son of Edith and James McAnany. Sixth of seven children. Raised by Robert Grant family, Midway, PA. Lived in Westland, PA with John Bentrem family. Worked in Westland Mine prior to entry into U.S. Army. Trained as Infantryman. Died in captivity during Bataan Death March. Remains not recovered.



Sgt. Earl "Bud" L. Kersten Age 23

Born February 3, 1920. Died April 10, 1943. Son of Ella and William Kersten, Westland, PA. Siblings Fred, William, Ruth, Harold, Elizabeth, Laura, Rebecca, Alice, Anna, Nancy. Graduate of Perryopolis H.S., Class of 1938. Employed at Westland Mine prior to enlistment in U.S. Air Force. Radio operator and gunner on B-17 Bomber that went down in the North African Campaign. Remains not recovered.



Pvt. Harold F. Ramacker -- Age 19

Born May 4, 1924. Died September 3, 1943. Son of Catherine and Joseph Ramacker, Belgium Hollow Road, Primrose, PA. Brother Louis. Infantryman in U.S. Army 7th Infantry, 3rd Division. Killed during North African Campaign. Buried in Midway Cemetery.



Pvt. Donald T. Gordon Age 21

Born August 17, 1922. Died September 9, 1943. Born to Hazel and Joseph T. Gordon, Jumbo Road, Primrose, PA. Brother Leroy. Attended Hickory H.S. through 11th grade. Withdrew from school intending to join Merchant Marines but parents withheld approval. Worked at Universal Cyclops prior to entry into U.S. Army. Infantryman and radio operator in 36th Infantry Division. Killed in Salerno, Italy. Buried in Midway Cemetery.



Pvt. Louis "Bruth" Kargle, Jr. Age 30

Born 1913. Died February 29, 1944. Son of Madeline and Louis Kargle, Sr., Belgium Hollow Road, Primrose, PA. Siblings Anna, Madeline, Frank. Entered U.S. Army in May 1943. Trained as equipment operator in Army Engineers. Died from injuries received in dozer accident in New Guinea. Buried in Guam.



2nd Lt. James "Mike" Herbert Bebout Age 21

Born Feb. 24, 1923. Died June 2, 1944. Third son of Alice & James Bebout, Kisnertown, Chartiers Twp. Graduate of Hickory H.S. Class of 1941. Siblings Clarence, Verne, Rowena, Elizabeth, Donald, Wayne. Enlisted in Air Force becoming a pilot of B-24 Bomber. Shot down over Germany. All crew members died except Bombardier. Buried in Arlington Cemetery.



Pfc. Grover "Buddy" C. Gould Age 20

Born 1924. Died June 6, 1944. Son of Olive and John Johnson, Vestaburg, PA. Adopted by Olive and Harry Gould, Southview, PA. Step-brother Thomas. U.S. Army Infantryman killed in troop ship sinking in the Mediterranean Sea enroute to North Africa. Remains not recovered.



2nd Lt. Malcolm M. Dinsmore Age 27

Born August 15, 1916. Died June 21, 1944. Only son of Laura and John Y. Dinsmore, Waterdam Road, Hickory, PA. Sister-Eleanor. Graduate of Hickory H.S., Class of 1935. Employed in Harness Racing with Delvin Miller. Entered U.S. Army Air Force. B-17 pilot in 571st Bomb Sq. 390th Bomb GP (H). Downed in English Channel returning from bomb run. Remains not recovered.



Sgt. Orrin G. Miller Age 26

Born June 30, 1918. Died July 27, 1944. Youngest son of Amy and Earl Miller, Bancroft Farm, Jefferson Twp. Siblings, Albert, Delvin, Margaret. Graduate of Hickory H.S., Class of 1938. Enlisted in Air Force, becoming a Turret gunner on a B-24 Bomber. Shot down over Budapest, Hungary. Remains not recovered.



Cpl. Joseph Mercier Age 24

Born March 9, 1920. Died July 30, 1944. Son of Louise and Jules Mercier, Primrose, PA. Siblings Louis, Jake, Dorothy. Attended Hickory H.S. Employed by Universal Cyclops prior to enlistment March 2, 1942 into U.S. Marine Corps. Departed Nov. 28, 1942 for the South Pacific. Killed during invasion of Guam while serving in the 3rd Marine Div. Buried in Hawaii.



Pvt. John T. Williams Age 27

Born January 3, 1917. Died August 3, 1944. Eldest son of Lucy and Taylor Williams, Main St., Hickory, PA. Siblings Dorothy, Cliff, Wilma. Wife Rose Marie. Graduate of Hickory H.S., Class of 1934. Truck driver for J.R. Cowden prior to draft Jan. 23, 1943 into U.S. Army Infantry. Killed in France. Buried in Mt. Prospect Cemetery, Hickory, PA.



Pvt. Charles H. Dotts Age 33

Born June 28, 1911. Died October 21, 1944. Only son of Vista Porter and L.M. Dotts, Marianna, PA. Wife Mildred Herron Dotts. Son Dick. Entered U.S. Army April 2, 1944. Killed serving in 119th Infantry Regiment in Ouken, Germany. Buried in Washington Cemetery.



2nd Lt. Roy L. Storrick -- Age 20

Born May 2, 1924. Died December 2, 1944. Eldest son of Kathryn and John Storrick, Washington, PA. Siblings Mary Jane, John, James, William, Richard. Enlisted in U.S. Army Air Force during 2nd year at W&J College. Co-pilot of B-24 downed during Bomb Run over France and Germany. Served in 564th Bomb Sq, 389th Bomb GR, 8th AAF. Buried in Washington Cemetery.



Ens. J. Wayne Scott Age 24

Born June 12, 1920. Died December 12, 1944. Son of Tillie and Walter Scott, Wabash Ave., Hickory, PA. Siblings Walter Jr., R. Kenneth, Paul, Samuel, Julia Belle. Wife Jean Leckey Scott. Graduate of Hickory H.S., Class of 1938. Enlisted 1943 in U.S. Navy. Skipper of LCT Boat in France Invasion. Died from illness during Bond Drive in Chicago, IL. Buried in Mt. Prospect Cemetery, Hickory, PA.



Pvt. Michael "Mitch" Morris Age 21

Born 1923. Died December 19, 1944. Youngest son of Anna and Harold Morris, Belgium Hollow Road, Primrose, PA. Siblings Andrew, Charles, Mary. Killed in Germany while serving in the U.S. Army Infantry. Buried in France..



Tech/5 Stephen "Steve" Bawolak, Jr. Age 26

Born March 14, 1918. Died December 25, 1944. Only son of Julia and Stephen Bawolak, Sr., Meriage Street, Primrose, PA. Wife Gladys Daudet Bawolak. Served in U.S. Army Amphibious Force. Killed during retaking of Leyte, Philippine Island. Buried Robinson Run Cemetery, McDonald, PA..



Sgt. Ernest "Ernie" G. Kaiser Age 34

Born June 27 1910. Died January 1, 1945. Only son of Eldora Kaiser, Youngwood, PA. Wife Nellie Rush Kaiser. Son David. 1932 graduate of W&J College. Physical Education teacher and Coach at Hickory H.S. prior to entry into U.S. Army Jan. 18, 1944. Killed in France serving in the 7th Army, 45th Thunderbolt Div., 180th Infantry. Buried in France.



Pfc. James "Jim" A. McDowell Age 22

Born March 6, 1923. Died April 17, 1945. Son of Margaret and John H. McDowell, Red Fox Rd., Hickory, PA. Siblings Ida Katherine, Sarah, John. Attended Hickory H.S. prior to entry Feb. 6, 1943 into U.S. Army Signal Corps. Departed March 1944 for England. Served in 4th Bn. in France, Belgium, Germany, Holland. Died from wounds received in Germany. Buried in Holland.



Sgt. Nicholas "Nick" Meriage Age 21

Born July 3, 1924. Died July 23, 1945. Son of Mary and Stanley Meriage, Primrose, PA. Siblings Millie, Sally, Michael, Paul, Lawrence. Graduate of Hickory H.S., Class of 1942. Employed by Universal Cyclops prior to entry February 18, 1943 in U.S. Army Air Force. Ball Gunner in B-24 that was downed in South Pacific. Remains not recovered.

No Photo Cpl. Joseph J. Manion, Jr. Age 30

Born March 23, 1916. Died October 6, 1946. Son of Agnes McCruske and Joseph Manion, Sr. Wife Sylvia Mae Manion. Siblings Mrs. Jack Loar, James. Enlisted 1937 in Field Artillery and re-enlisted 1940 in U.S. Army Air Force Police. Killed in military staff car accident while on patrol duty between Harrisburg and Hershey, PA. Buried in Canonsburg Cemetery.

Pfc. Howard Andrews Age 24

Born Oct. 23, 1926. Died April 25, 1951 in Korea. Son of Helen and Carl Andrews Sr., Southview, PA. Siblings Carl Jr., Donald, Bert, Geraldine, Kenneth, Richard. Attended Southview Elementary School. leaving to drive father's coal truck. Employed by Universal Cyclops when drafted into Army. Became Infantryman in E Co., 2nd BN, 7th Regiment, 3rd Division in Korea. Listed MIA in combat at Uijongbu-Tongduchon. Presumed dead Dec. 31, 1953 and Purple Heart delivered to family in 1954.



3/C Robert "Bob" Wilson Davidson Age 19

Born Feb. 11, 1934. Died Oct. 1, 1953 in Georgia. First son of Dorothy and Alvin Davidson, Dairy Road, Hickory, PA. Siblings Margaret, Helen, Gladys, Joanne, Wayne, Nancy, John, Carolyn. Attended Hickory H.S. through 11th grade. Graduated from Washington H.S. in 1952, enlisting in the Army Air Force. Died in B25 crash in Columbus, GA. Buried in Washington Cemetery.



Pfc. Norman Robert "Bob" Allshouse Age 21


Born Oct. 14, 1933. Died Aug. 7, 1955 in Kentucky. Son of Anna and John Allshouse, Westland, PA. Siblings Dorothy, Phyllis, Margaret, Bill, Edith. Graduate of Hickory H.S., Class of 1952. Enlisted in Army becoming a Paratrooper in Ft. Campbell, KY. Died from injuries received in an automobile accident. Buried in Robinson Run Cemetery, McDonald, PA.



Sp4/C Robert "Bob" Mason Campbell Age 24

Born Mar. 20, 1940. Died Aug. 25. 1964 in Germany. Son of Florella and Walter Campbell, Sawmill Lane, Hickory, PA. Siblings Donald, Doris, Richard, William. Graduate of Hickory H.S., Class of 1959. Water well driller for Marcott Drilling prior to draft into Army. Became a mechanic and served in Co. C, 2nd BN, 48th Infantry Div. in Germany. Fatally injured while towing a disabled Army vehicle near Grafenwohr, Germany. Buried in Mt. Prospect Cemetery, Hickory, PA.





Born Aug. 2, 1943. Died March 5, 1966 in Vietnam. Son of Mary and Jerome Zoog, Main St., Hickory, PA. Sibling Roy. Graduate of Ft. Cherry H.S., Class of 1963. Enlisted in U.S. Marine Corps. While serving in I Company, 3rd BN, 1st Marine Div. in Vietnam. Killed in fighting around Quang Ngai. Buried in Forrest Lawn Gardens, McMurray Cemetery.



1st Lt. Donald Wayne Jacobs Age 22

Born Sept. 20, 1945. Died June 11, 1968 in Vietnam. Son of Alvie C. and Elizabeth Jacobs, Jacobs Rd., McDonald, PA. Siblings Alvie, Florence, Willard, Mary Ann, Richard, Janet, David. Graduate of Ft. Cherry H.S. and Washington School of Drafting in 1963. Employed by Weirton Steel prior to 1964 draft into Army. Graduate Officer's Candidate School and Army Aviation School. Commissioned as Recon Pilot in the Head Hunters Group 219th. 223rd AVN. BN. 17th. AVE. GP. 1st AVN. BDE. Killed in Vietnam. Buried in Mt. Prospect Cemetery, Hickory, PA.




Sgt. Lanos Jeffrey "Jeff" Cowden Age 21

Sgt. Joseph "Joe" P. Bongiorni III Age 20

Born Jan. 30, 1971. Died Feb. 25, 1991 in Saudi Arabia. Son of Rita and Joseph Bongiorni Jr., Burgettstown Rd., Hickory, PA. Sisters Lorie, Jody. Enlisted in Army Reserves in high school. Graduated from Ft. Cherry H.S., Class of 1989. During 2nd year at WVU, volunteered for the Persian Gulf War. Killed while serving in 14th QM Detachment, Dhahran, Saudi Arabia. Buried in Mt. Prospect Cemetery, Hickory, PA.
