NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY

The National Honor Society and its activities are an essential function in the administration of a modern secondary school.

The National Honor Society has set the following high professional aims and goals for secondary school members:

1. An enthusiasm for good scholarship throughout the school.
2. An encouragement of a desire for students to render service to the school and the community.
3. A plan for self-evaluation of the student of the potential leadership qualities within him.
4. A stimulus to the student to observe and practice those acts of others that develop strength of character.
5. An encouragement to the student to continue his learning and education.

Membership in the National Honor Society is based on four main areas: scholarship, leadership, service, and character. All students having a B average or better are automatically eligible students for membership. This list of eligible students is then presented to the faculty for consideration of leadership, service, and character. Such factors as initiative, executive ability, work as members in clubs or a class, personal service for teachers, dependability, industry, honesty, and personality are all considered when the faculty rates the eligibility list on the three traits mentioned above. Any student who rates low on these areas is denied membership in the National Honor Society. Sophomores are probationary members and become active members in their junior year if the high standards indicated during their probationary period are maintained.

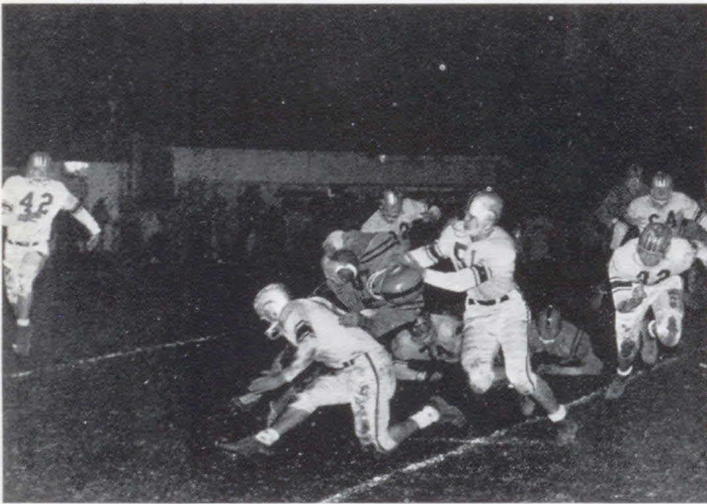

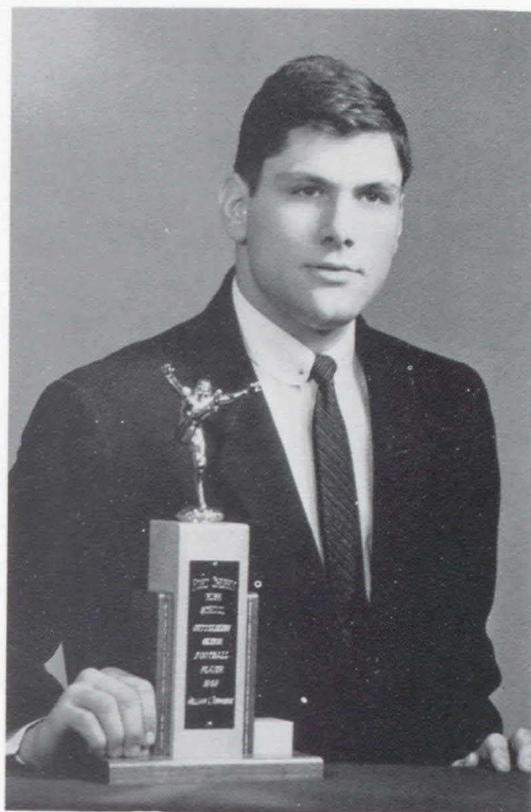
Cross-country presents the boys of Fort Cherry with an opportunity to improve themselves physically and at the same time share in the rewards of participating in a team sport.
