priate adjustments and decisions in light of this understanding, to accept the responsibility for this choice, and to follow a course of action in harmony with his choice.



The Student Council is an organization of students, elected by students, to serve as official representatives of the student body in all matters concerning the students themselves.




Council members are elected from each homeroom in the tenth, eleventh, and twelfth grades. John Haught, president of Student Council, is also president of the student body.



The National Honor Society and its activities are an essential function in the administration of a modern secondary school.

The National Honor Society has set the following high professional aims and goals for secondary school members:

- 1. An enthusiasm for good scholarship throughout the school.
- An encouragement of a desire for students to render service to the school and the community.
- 3. A plan for self-evaluation of the student of the potential leadership qualities within him.
- A stimulus to the student to observe and practice those acts of others that develop strength of character.

collecting Christmas cards for the service projects. The money making projects were the dance and Easter egg sale, which were both very successful.


