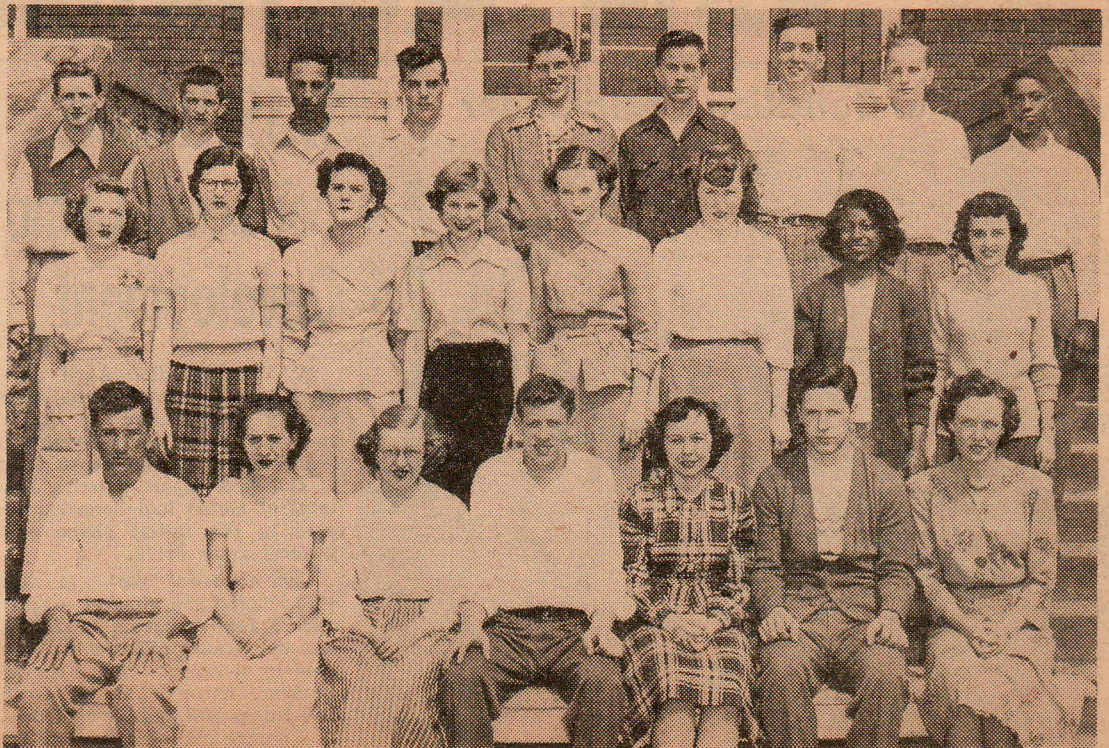


"Our Town" To Be Staged By Hickory Seniors 1950
