




Shaynak was killed instantly, Jackson said, and Carter died en route to Washington Hospital. Hospital authorities said death was attributed to skull fractures.

Man killed en route from Beverly funeral

An Indianapolis man who was killed in an auto accident on I-74 in Green Township was returning home after attending the funeral of a relative who died in the Beverly Hills fire.

Police said Matthew Reed Welch Jr., 60, apparently suffered a heart attack and lost control of his car on the interstate highway Wednesday evening as he was en route home from the funeral of Virginia Ramler, 52, of Erlanger, Ky.

Police said Welch was driving westbound on I-74 near the Race Road overpass when the car crossed the center line, went through the eastbound lanes, over an embankment and overturned.




